Justification

The reporting requirement poses an unnecessary administrative burden on the Department of Energy. The report and briefing have provided very little value to the Board during my tenure. The one significant criticality safety issue that has been addressed during my tenure occurred at LANL. Despite the Board's annual requirement for a report and briefing, the staffing shortage at LANL reached crisis levels. On March 6, 2013, the NNSA Administrator submitted a 20-page criticality safety report to the Board. Regarding LANL, the report concluded, "A Corrective Action Plan that includes compensatory safety measures has been submitted to NNSA by LANL. *NNSA judges that the metrics reported and the incentives in use place the emphasis where it is needed to bring the program to compliance.*" (emphasis added) Fortunately, the Board's staff knew the true conditions. In May 2013 the staff performed an extensive on-site criticality safety review at LANL using the Board's normal authority to obtain access to information under section 2286c of the enabling statute. In June 2013, LANL paused all operations at TA-55 due to criticality safety concerns.

My conclusion: the report doesn't work. The normal review process does.

This letter revisesends the previously established annual reporting requirement regarding the Department of Energy's (DOE) Nuclear Criticality Safety Program. This reporting requirement included an annual report on criticality safety and a formal briefing to the Board to discuss the report. While this report has served as a valuable resource for information on complex-wide criticality safety issues, trends, and corrective actions, improvements can be made we are confident that criticality safety information can be obtained from your staff using the normal cooperation provisions of 42 U.S.C §2286c and that a formal reporting requirement under 42 U.S.C. § 2286b(d) is no longer necessary.

Consequently, our staff has collaborated with your staff to develop revised reporting eriteria with the goal of improving DOE's criticality safety programs while minimizing the administrative burden associated with producing the report. Therefore, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 2286b(d), the annual reporting requirement established for closure of Recommendation 97-2, Continuation of Criticality Safety at Defense Nuclear Facilities in the Department of Energy (DOE) Complex, is modified to require an annual metrics table on criteria listed in the enclosure to this letter in lieu of a full report. We still desire an annual briefing and will communicate the requested briefing topics to your staff no later than 45 days prior to the briefing. Due to this modification, we extend the due date for the Fiscal Year 2015 annual metrics table and briefing to April 1, 2016.
