Brief description of Requested Action: The technical staff is directed to postpone for the remainder of FY16 any activity regarding toxicological consequences at the Low Activity Waste (LAW) Facility. In particular, the staff is directed to postpone activity associated with potential toxicological hazards identified in the LAW Design and Operability (D&O) Report. The bounding <u>unmitigated</u> radiological dose consequences to the public and the co-located workers from postulated accidents at LAW are predicted to be well below DOE's evaluation guidelines. The delay will permit the Board to determine through the annual work plan process an appropriate staff priority to place on issues related to toxicological consequences at the LAW.

As stated in the request, I seek a delay in staff activity related to the design of the Low Activity Waste facility at the Hanford Waste Treatment and Immobilization Plant. The staff is currently tracking a number of potential design deficiencies related to the control of toxicological hazards. The question presented is whether this expenditure of our staff resources is an appropriate priority for our agency. The request seeks a delay in order to have a more thorough review of agency priorities by the Board during our consideration of the FY17 work plan. The Low Activity Waste facility is not scheduled to operate until the year 2022, thus the requested delay is not significant.

I believe that the expenditure of our resources in this instance – with a corresponding expenditure on the part of DOE and its contractors who must respond to our staff – is not an appropriate use of resources. The Atomic Energy Act directs us to "review the design of a new Department of Energy defense nuclear facility before construction of such facility begins and shall recommend to the Secretary, within a reasonable time, such modifications of the design as the Board considers necessary to ensure adequate protection of public health and safety." The phrase 'adequate protection of the public health and safety' has traditionally been limited to *radiological* hazards. In *New Hampshire v. Atomic Energy Commission*, 406 F.2d 170 (1st Cir. 1969) the Court expressly considered the question and determined that Congress wrote the statute having only in mind the special hazards of radioactivity. Current analysis of the Low Activity Waste facility concludes that for every conceivable accident the radiological dose consequences will be at least one order of magnitude below DOE's evaluation guidelines, and in most cases more than one order of magnitude below guidelines. Moreover, these estimates assumed no mitigation of any kind. This raises the question why the DNFSB should concern

itself at all with the design of the facility. Absent analysis by our staff that reveals a potential for significant radiological dose consequences at the Low Activity Waste facility that might be triggered by a toxicological or other industrial accident, I see no reason to further investigate the design.

It is true that workers at the facility could be injured by a toxicological hazard. But it equally true that a worker could be injured by falling down the stairs if the handrail is not properly designed and constructed to meet building codes. The mere fact that someone could be injured at a defense nuclear facility does not by itself make the hazard a radiological hazard.

The Board should consider what hazards other than radiological hazards are appropriate areas for staff inquiry. I urge my fellow Board Members to consider that question during the formulation of the FY17 work plan, and I further urge the delay of staff activity related to the Low Activity Waste facility until we have had the opportunity to consider the question
