The request seeks a delay for the remainder of the fiscal year in staff activity directed towards potential toxicological consequences at the new Uranium Processing Facility currently under design by NNSA contractors. The requested delay would provide an opportunity during our FY17 work planning process to reassess whether the subject area should be further pursued by our staff.

Our efforts on UPF could potentially impact the public health and safety in a negative way. The 9212 facility is long overdue for retirement, and the longer it must operate the greater the safety risk at Y-12 will be. If our actions on UPF were to cause further delay or unnecessary cost in the design, construction and eventual operation of that new facility, any reduction we might achieve in safety risk at UPF will be offset by continued operations in the outdated 9212 facility. This safety trade-off suggests that we proceed cautiously.

I am not convinced that there is significant safety gain to be achieved by further pursuit of potential toxicological consequence issues at the new UPF, and I am concerned that our pursuit of these issues unnecessarily consumes NNSA's resources. Our staff has planned a mid-June review of the UPF project team's toxicological materials consequence analysis. Even a cursory look at the agenda sent by our staff to the UPF project team makes clear that a great deal of effort will be required by the project team to meet the demands of our staff. In preparation for the review, our staff has requested from the project team various information, including an explanation as to why the project team intends to invoke certain DOE limits instead of the toxicological limits of the American Industrial Hygiene Association, a breakdown of toxicological material-at-risk by chemical compound type to include how that breakdown would be altered if materials burn in a fire, and a justification for the selection of certain factors used in

an eight factor mathematical formula for estimating threshold (i.e., "safe") material-at-risk values.

We have the time available for a careful review by the Board of the safety risk trade-offs involved. While our statute requires us to advise the Secretary of Energy during the design of a new facility should we find changes are needed to ensure the adequate protection of the public health and safety, the statute only requires us to render advice "within a reasonable time" before construction begins. Construction is at least 15 months away, therefore the staff's planned mid-June review is not yet time-critical.

In summary, we should proceed cautiously and we have the time available to do so. The staff's planned activity should be delayed.
